Present Simple (do,does, -es) - general statements, regular activities - every day, always, usually, often, never - He doesn't work in this company.	Present Continuous (am/is/are + ing) - situations happening now, temporarily, exceptions, things happening too often - now, at the moment, these days, currently - He isn't working now, he is ill.
Past Simple (did, -ed, II.form) - finished things and activities in the past - ago, last, in 1999, in the past, when I was a child - He worked here but then he gave up.	Past Continuous (was/were + ing) - things happening in the past, focused on the activity - this time yesterday, when something was in progress - in combination with past simple: When I was walking in the park, I met my friend.
 Present Perfect Simple (have/has + III.form) something that started in the past and continues until now or influences the present, "result" just, already, yet, never, ever, since, for, so far, the first time, once, twice, always Have you ever been to China? 	Present Perfect Continuous (have/has + been + ing) - the same like present perfect but focused on the activitiy, "action" - for, since, how long - How long have you been working here?
Past Perfect Simple (had + III.form) - event in the past that (had) happened before another event in the past - just, already, before, after - When he came home he realized he had left his mobile at home.	 Past Perfect Continuous (had + been + ing) the same like past perfect simple but with focus on the activity Before he moved to the country he had been living and working in the city centre.
